



FROM THE ACCOUNTS DEPARTMENT

Conveyance Allowance

The conveyance allowance is a form of financial assistance to help families in rural and regional Victoria with the cost of transporting their children to their nearest appropriate school/campus. The conveyance allowance is available to eligible students travelling by public transport, private car and public bus.

In summary for Highview Students to be eligible:

- Students must attend their closest non-government 'Christian' College
- Reside 4.8km or more from Highview
- Reside 4.8km or more from the closest 'Free Bus Service' bus stop

Camps Sports and Excursion Fund (CSEF)

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. The CSEF is paid directly to the school and is allocated to the school camp/excursion portion of the school fees. Forms will be accepted until 30 June 2017, however, forms are encouraged to be returned as soon as possible.

SEQTA UPDATE - REPORTS ON LINE 24/7

Highview College has moved to continuous reporting in 2017 powered by the market-leading learning management system, SEQTA. This allows parents and guardians to have real-time and accurate access to results, feedback, and resources when it is relevant to them. Access is provided through our parent portal, 'Highview Engage'.

Already approximately 77% of Highview College students have at least one parent registered to access 'Highview Engage'. The benefits of having this access include:

- Being able to see task requirements and due dates to allow for improved organisation and planning
- Having access to feedback on tasks as it is provided by the teacher, ensuring that results and feedback are never lost
- Real-time engagement with content and ideas explored within the classroom, including access to relevant resources.
- The ability to engage with the College more easily with regard to pastoral care, absences, access to timetables, and communicating with teachers.

Many parents who login to Highview Engage have recognised the benefits it will provide to them and their students. Some of the positive feedback we have received include:

'Highview Engage is beneficial as it has everything accessible at our fingertips.'

A benefit is that I can see how my child is progressing throughout the term rather than waiting until parent/teacher/student interviews or end of the year so that any perceived issues he has at school can be addressed sooner rather than later.'

'I don't need to bug my kids about when homework is due – I can login and see it for myself and help them stay organised.'

I love to see my son get constructive feedback so he can improve along the way.

Highview Engage is extremely user-friendly. I login twice a week to see what is coming up and find out what has happened.'

Overall this is a great initiative by Highview and I look forward to the year ahead. I do hope all teachers embrace SEQTA knowing that there are parents like me who will appreciate their feedback throughout the year.

MUSIC AT HIGHVIEW

INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC

We are pleased to announce that our Instrumental Music Program has been extended in 2017 to provide our student's opportunities to participate in a range of performing groups (e.g rock band, contemporary groups, etc).

The Extra-curricular program promotes teamwork and community involvement through regular rehearsals and public performances. It is a fantastic opportunity for students to be involved in an extension of their academic study in order to receive a well-balanced schooling experience.

Students in the program attend a 40-minute band rehearsal during a lunch time each week with other students who have similar musical skills and experience. Currently, the intermediate band is rehearsing on Friday, while the Junior Band will rehearse each Wednesday. Rehearsals will commence in Term 2.

RENOVATIONS OF OUR MUSIC CENTRE

We are currently planning for a huge renovation in our Music Centre in order to enrich our curriculum offerings with 21st-century music technology, as well as providing students access to instrumental rooms purposely built for private music lessons.

A fully equipped recording studio with three soundproofed recording booths is one of the features in our Music Centre. Students will have access to the studio through classroom Music and Instrumental Music programs.

We are grateful for the support of the 'P&FA' who are assisting us financially to create our very first music lab in our music classroom. The lab has the latest Digital Audio Workstation (DAW) setup for our students to explore, manipulate, create, record, and generate sound on a digital platform. The curriculum design for integrating the DAW is mainly project-based learning and students will be able to produce projects such as music and sound effects for games and movies, creating ring tones, sound sampling for talking robot and virtual instruments.

These are exciting times for Music at Highview College.

CAREERS

WORK EXPERIENCE

All Year 10 students need to be reminded that they are required to do Work Experience this year. Work Experience week is Monday 26 June to Friday 30 June, which is the last week of term 2. If you haven't already started looking for a work place then it is probably timely to investigate areas of employment that interest you and enquire with prospective employers. If you intend completing Work Experience in an industry based work place eg. electrical, plumbing, carpentry etc. then you will also require a White Card to work onsite. This can be arranged through the school and depending on numbers, will cost between \$140 - \$150. This qualification has no expiry, therefore, will be valuable for future use. If you have difficulty finding placement please call into the Careers Office where Work Experience forms are also available.

UMAT

Are you in Year 12 and considering a career in Medicine or Dentistry? Then you will need to sit the compulsory UMAT (Undergraduate Medicine and Health Sciences Admissions Test). Registrations are already open and close at 5pm on 2 June 2017. The UMAT takes place on 26 July 2017 and results released late September. There are a number of companies that offer UMAT preparation courses. For more information visit the Careers Office.

SWINBURNE NEWS

Swinburne is both a university and a TAFE provider. Its main campus is in Hawthorn, right by Glenferrie station. It also has campuses in Croydon and Wantirna. It offers courses through from Certificates to Doctorates.

- SCHOLARSHIPS From 2017 onwards, scholarships of \$5,000pa will be automatically offered to Swinburne applicants who receive an ATAR of 95 or more (no separate application required). Various grants are also available (apply direct to Swinburne). In addition, the High Achievers Program (HAP) will provide students receiving an ATAR of 95 or more with mentors, a personalised program, projects, and one-on-one assistance.
- NEW COURSES AT SWINBURNE IN 2017 will be the Bachelor of Nursing (with a technology focus) and the Bachelor of Engineering Practice. There will also be a Diploma of Advanced Technologies.
- Swinburne is commencing an EARLY LEADERS PROGRAM. The ELP provides secondary students with opportunities to build and document their individual strengths and interests. The program identifies students who show enthusiasm and achievement in areas outside their secondary studies, including volunteer work, club or society participation, school projects and career exploration. By documenting and reflecting on their skills and achievements, students will create a valuable resource with certified credentials from Swinburne for use in applications for employment, further study or other pursuits. Part of the reason for this program is that students are individuals with individual talents that may
