As a result of their efforts, we have had three teams qualify for the 'Champion

In this tournament, our teams will play against other qualifying teams from regional Victoria, Melbourne, and Tasmania with an opportunity for our teams to be crowned the true Champion of Champions.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. The CSEF is paid directly to the school and is allocated to the school camp/excursion portion of the school fees. Forms will be accepted until **30 June 2017**, however, forms are encouraged to be returned as soon as possible.

UNIFORM EXPECTATIONS

Highview College has a proud uniform, with summer and winter versions and specific sport items.

The winter uniform includes long pants for boys and either long pants or the winter kilt for girls. For warmth, students may wear extra layers under their uniform (as long as they cannot be seen at all). The School jumper, blazer and tie may be worn for warmth with the school uniform. The School blazer and tie are not compulsory in 2018. A light navy rain jacket (this is different to the sports jacket) can be worn over the jumper/blazer in wet weather and is available to purchase at Macks now. No other jackets may be worn with the uniform in 2018.

The Sports uniform has been refined following student feedback. We now have new shorts and a new shirt will be available soon. It is acceptable to wear items of sports uniform even if they are being phased out. Hoodies and Sports Jackets may only be worn with Physical Education or Sports Uniform or at sporting events.

Students are also reminded that only one pair of earrings (worn in the lobe) is permitted – small silver, gold or pearl studs or plain silver/gold sleepers. No other jewellery should be visible.


Highview School bags will be compulsory for students in Years 7 to 10 in 2018.

Successful applicants need a minimum ATAR of 50 for entry to courses (excluding some professional degree programs). You will also need to meet all course prerequisites and any special requirements for your preferred course. Applications are now open and will close on 31 August 2017. 




